FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

2nd Sunday of Easter, Year "C"

Divine Mercy Sunday: Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God

Filled with Easter joy I remembered a story I once read online about a conversation a holy man once had with the Lord. The holy man said, "Lord, I would like to know what Heaven and Hell look like."

The Lord led the holy man to two doors. God opened one of the doors and the Holy man looked in. In the middle of the room was a large round table. In the middle of the table was a large pot of stew, which smelled delicious and made the holy man's mouth water.

The people sitting around the table were thin and sickly. They appeared to be famished. They were holding spoons with very long handles that were strapped to their arms and each found it possible to reach into the pot of stew and take a spoonful. But because the handle was longer than their arms, they could not get the spoons back into their mouths.

The holy man shuddered at the sight of their misery and suffering. The Lord said, "You have seen Hell."

They went to the next room and opened the door.

It was exactly the same as the first one. There was the large round table with the large pot of stew which made the holy man's mouth water. The people were equipped with the same long-handled spoons, but here the people were well nourished and plump, laughing and talking.

The holy Man said, "I don't understand."

"It is simple," said the Lord. "It requires but one skill. You see, they have learned to feed each other, while the greedy think only of themselves."

"Remember this, when Jesus died on the cross, he was thinking of you."

HAPPY EASTER, EVERYONE!

For our sake the risen Lord appears to the apostles who locked themselves up in the upper room for fear of the Jews. Jesus comes to assure them that the resurrection is real. The risen Lord is not a phantom of imagination. It is Jesus Christ in His fullness of divinity and humanity – with flesh and blood for us to see and touch.

Celebrating Easter today and tomorrow becomes the best way for believers all over the world to celebrate the triumph of good over evil, light over darkness, justice over injustice, truth over lies, peace over war, and order over chaos.

By celebrating Easter, we celebrate the value of sacrificial love, peace, truth, beauty, hope, patience, and the renewal of our belief in God's promise to be with us until the end of time.

Today, we celebrate a unique value of our religion – the founders of other world religions are dead but Jesus is alive. Jesus lives to die no more.

By virtue of the resurrection of Jesus believers are assured that Jesus is Lord and God "My Lord and my God" says Thomas. Jesus is the cosmocrat, the pantocrator – He has the whole world in His hands.

Celebrating the resurrection of Jesus is therefore a foundational feast in the Church for the following reasons:

The resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of Christian Faith. It is the fulfillment of a divine promise which affirms our belief in Jesus as Lord and God - *"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain"* (1 Cor 15:14).

The resurrection of Jesus is a foundational guarantee of our own resurrection. In the fullness of time God will raise up and transform this wretched bodies of ours into copies of His own in glory. Like Martha at the tomb of Lazarus, Jesus assures us *"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me will live even in death..."* (Jn 11:25-26).

The resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of our hope - Even in this world of pain, sorrow and tears, we are assured that life is worth living. The resurrection of Jesus empowers us even now to fight against structures of oppression, corruption, injustice, and to promote structures that make for freedom from bondage, ignorance, unnecessary worries, fears and to keep moving forward in joyful hope until the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of our prayers: We worship a living God who is always with us to lead us and guide us to the truth. Our prayers are not in vain, for God hears and answers prayers. God's promise is true – Yes & Amen. If God did it for Jesus, God will also do it for all for whom Jesus died on the cross to save.

Whenever we celebrate Easter, believers all over the world renew their resolve to:

Live the lives of a resurrected people: We are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of fear, sins, despair, discouragement, disappointment and doubts. Instead, we are expected to live in joyful hope, constantly experiencing the living presence of the risen Lord who loves us in all things and above all things.

Honor the virtue of sacrifice both personal and communal. At all times and in all places, believers should not shy away from making sacrifices and stand for what they believe. Whatever is good, beautiful, just, noble and true, those are the values that we should aspire and die for.

Respect the human body. We are created in the image and likeness of God. Our body is not rubbish to be thrashed. Human body should be honored and respected at all times and believers should always work for the integrity of all living beings. We should always work to build a world where everyone has a place to call a home.

Become Jesus made visible in the world today. Believers are called to worship the divine and live for eternity. Whenever we practice Christian charity, mercy, patience, forgiveness, and each time we stand for truth, justice and peace, we share in the Resurrection of Jesus.

The entire life of Jesus is a life lived for the good of others. Jesus went about doing good. He suffered that we may have life and have it in abundance. He rose from death so that we may have eternal life. Living for the good of others becomes the eternal fruit of the resurrection.

The resurrection of Jesus becomes the perpetual foundation of our hope. Jesus lives to die no more, and because He lives, we can face tomorrow. Let us therefore be willing to leave the prison of the upper room caused by fear and to embrace the good news of the resurrection by spreading joy, peace, love, and work hard to renew the face of the earth. Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia.
