FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Corpus Christ, Year "A" The Body and Blood of Christ – Do this in remembrance of Me.

Once upon a time, there was a man named J.W. Gibson. He knew what it was like to be hungry.

"He grew up hungry. And he said he never wanted to see anyone else go hungry again," says Gibson's daughter Mary Gibson Bell.

That's why the builder who had a passion for gardening decided to start donating his extra crops to the local FISH Hospitality food pantry in Knoxville, Tennessee. It started small, with just one load of turnips. But that small offering turned into something much bigger. Today, Gibson's family works an entire farm solely to donate the crops.

"It just started to grow and grow and it continued to grow until he passed away in 2012 and we decided to carry his legacy on," Bell goes on to say.

And carry on they do. Last year alone the farm produced over 33,000 ears of corn, all for those in need. But it isn't just corn. The family also farms greens, tomatoes, okra, peppers, cucumbers, apples and kale.

Truly a family affair, the extended Gibson family lives and works on the land their grandfather bought 30 years ago.

"You take a delivery and you go see where it goes and you see all the people who it feeds, it's like wow. Out in the field it's like why am I doing it? But then you get out there and you see it-it makes a total different story after that," says Gibson's grandson Tate.

It seems Gibson's legacy is a long-lasting one, a sentiment echoed by his family.

"He instilled it in us that you do good deeds for people and your life is better," says Bell (Elissa Koehl "Grandpa's entire farm dedicated to feeding the hungry").

God will always do what God does best, and that is feeding the poor and the hungry. God fed the Israelites in Egypt and while in the desert of sin as they walked on to freedom, God fed them with manna. By eating the manna from heaven, the Israelites were able to have enough strength to march on to the Promised Land.

Food is a sign of love and eating the food God gives to His people demonstrates a confident trust in the love and power of God. Abraham gave food to strangers and for that he was blessed. The prophet Elijah ate the food from heaven through the generosity of Ravens and a widow. The prophet Elisha fed a hundred people in 2 Kgs 4:42-44.

Giving food to the hungry is one of the easiest and best ways to encounter God. "For I was hungry and you fed me, naked and you clothed me ... whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, you do to me."

Our celebration of the solemnity of Corpus Christi – The most holy body and blood of Christ serves a dual purpose. Firstly, it is a reminder of the importance of the body and blood Christ in the life of the children of God.

The Eucharist is the center and summit of Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself" (CCC #1324).

The Eucharist forms the community. Whenever we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, we gather to celebrate who we are – the living body of Christ on earth. We do not gather as individuals, we gather as the church – the living body of Christ on earth. In the celebration of the Eucharist, we give thanks to God, and Jesus takes us from where we are to where God wants us to be.

The Eucharist redefines and reorients the purpose of earthly food. Earthly food is not an end in itself but a means to an end. Jesus said that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Earthly food is good in as much as it prepares and gives us strength to work for the things of God.

When the apostles looked at 5 loaves and 2 fish with human eyes, that food was not enough to feed 5000 people, but when Jesus looked at it with spiritual eyes; it was more than enough to feed the multitude with fragments left over able to fill 12 wicker baskets.

We need to become what we eat and cultivate the mind of God. God has blessed us with many riches in Christ. All we need to do is to think outside the box — with an attitude of cooperation and not competition; there will be no hungry person on earth. God has blessed us with enough resources needed to make this world a better place for all. What we need is a grateful heart.

It is sad to see some Christians who are against providing food for the poor or universal healthcare for all. Offering a good life for all does not in any way diminish the quality of life we are living now and if anything, it will serve to enhance and make for the wellbeing of all. It will improve the reign of peace, justice, security in our land and good health for all.

Secondly, the Eucharist is a food for the journey – journey to heaven. The Eucharist is food from heaven given to all who love God and who wish to unite with God after their life's journey on earth. It is a reminder that this world is not our home. We are merely passing through. Our true home is in heaven, where we shall unite to celebrate and feast with the saints and angels.

Celebrating the Eucharist becomes an invitation to live for higher values. It is a mandate to think and act like Jesus who feeds the hungry and provides for the needs of the poor. It is therefore incompatible for one to claim to be a child of God, and yet boldly detest and maltreat the poor in our midst. This is not to tolerate those who abuse programs meant to help the poor but a desire for us to consolidate our efforts to wipe out corruption and channel things meant for the poor to benefit the poor and the needy in our midst.

No matter how ordinary it may look, in the celebration of the Eucharist we commune with God. We touch God. God feeds us and empowers us to feed all who are hungry in the world. Amen.






Peter's Pence
