FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Trinity Sunday Year "A"

One God in Three Unique Persons (Father-Son-Holy Spirit).

Once upon a time, there was a flock of doves that flew in search of food, led by their king. One day, they had flown a long distance and were very tired. The dove king encouraged them to fly a little farther. The smallest dove picked up speed and found some rice scattered beneath a banyan tree. So all the doves landed and began to eat.

Suddenly, a net fell over them and they were all trapped. They saw a hunter approaching, carrying a huge club. The doves desperately fluted their wings, trying to get out, but to no avail. The king had an idea. He advised all the doves to fly up together, carrying the net with them. He said that there was strength in unity.

Each dove picked up a portion of the net, and together they flew off, carrying the net with them. The hunter looked up in astonishment. He tried to follow them, but they were flying high over hills and valleys. They flew to a hill near a city of temples, where there lived a mouse who could help them. He was a faithful friend of the dove king.

When the mouse heard the loud noise of their approach, he went into hiding. The dove king gently called out to him, and then the mouse was happy to see him. The dove king explained that they had been caught in a trap and needed the mouse's help to gnaw at the net with his teeth and set them free.

The mouse agreed, saying that he would set the king free first. The king insisted that he free his subjects first and the king last. The mouse understood the king's feelings and complied with his wishes. He began to cut the net, and one by one all the doves were freed, including the dove king.

They all thanked the mouse and flew away together, united in their strength (Moral Stories – "Unity is Strength").

Before ascending into heaven, Jesus said that the Holy Spirit, our advocate before God, would lead us to the truth: "*When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come*" (Jn 16:13).

Having celebrated Pentecost Sunday last week, today we celebrate a foundational truth of our faith – the mystery of the holy and blessed Trinity. This truth is so profound that no human mind can comprehend it. It is a truth that could not have been revealed to the Church by anyone other than the Holy Spirit. Hence, it is ranked as the most fundamental and essential teaching in the "hierarchy of the truths of faith."

Simply put, the dogma of the Holy Trinity states that there are three persons in one God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Bible speaks of the Father as God (Phil 1:2), Jesus Christ as God (Titus 2:13), and the Holy Spirit as God (Acts 5:3-4). This means that God is one in essence but exists in three distinct persons: God the Father in creation, God the Son in redemption, and God the Holy Spirit in the sanctification of the world.

According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* #253: "*The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e., by nature one God.*" Three distinct persons, yet one God.

Whenever the children of God gather to pray, they begin their prayer "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." We are incorporated into Christ through baptism, and we are baptized "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." We glorify God by saying, "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit." We are blessed "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This means that we are a product of a triune God, and in the world of the holy and blessed Trinity we live, move, and have our being.

Whenever we gather to celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity, we do not gather to explain but to worship a mysterious God who is beyond human comprehension. Our inability to explain the dogma does not mean that it is irrational, but rather non-rational. It is a profound truth that cannot be reduced to human comprehension. What the human mind cannot explain, we adore, worship, and glorify with humility and faith.

From the dogma of the Holy Trinity, we learn that unity is strength. As people who worship a triune God, we are expected to live like the God we worship. Each human being is a unique individual, but we are also interconnected and interrelated. We need to love and respect each other for mutual coexistence in the world. None of us can do it alone; it is by working together that we promote the reign of justice, peace, love, and unity in the world.

From the dogma of the Holy Trinity, we learn that humility is a virtue. Like Jesus, who, though he was God, did not claim equality with God, but humbled himself and assumed the role of a servant—and for that reason, God exalted him on high—it is by humbling ourselves that we learn the profound truth about God, the ultimate truth that sets us free.

From the dogma of the Holy Trinity, we learn that Christian life is all about balance. We should avoid extremes, for virtue lies in the middle. As people who live in a multicultural and diverse world, among people with diverse worldviews, the Holy Trinity provides a model for finding equilibrium in our lives and in our relationships.

From the dogma of the Holy Trinity, we learn that Christians worship a transcendental and eternal truth that may not always be reduced to logical reasoning. It encourages us to be always open and to leave room for the unknown. Since we do not know it all, we need to be open to learning more about our faith. We need to work hard through prayer and good works to deepen our knowledge and relationship with God.

Finally, as the products of a triune God, we are never alone. God is always with us. We belong to a reality that is greater than who we are. The true meaning of our incorporation into Christ is a treasure to be worshiped and adored. It is a truth that sets us free and adds meaning and value to our lives. Since we are valuable to God, we should treat each other as such. We need to work together to build a community of love, peace, and justice.
