FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

9th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "A"

"The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ"

Once upon a time two brothers who lived at nearby farms fell into conflict. It was the first serious rift in 40 years of farming side by side. They had been sharing machinery, trading labor and goods as needed without a hitch. Then the long collaboration fell apart. It began with a little misunderstanding and it grew into a major indifference which exploded into an exchange of bitter words and followed by weeks of silence.

One morning there was a knock on elder brother's door. He opened it to find a man with a carpenter's toolbox. "I am looking for a few days of work", he said. "Perhaps you would have a few small jobs here and there. Could I help you?"

"Yes!" said the elder brother. "I do have a job for you. Look across the creek at that farm. That's my neighbor, in fact, it's my younger brother and we don't get along. Last week he dug a wider passage for water into his farm. But he ended up creating a very wide creek in between our farms and I am sure he did it just to annoy me. I want you to build me something so that we don't have to stand and see each other's face from across."

The carpenter said "I think I understand the situation. I will be able to do a job that will please you." The elder brother had to go to town for supplies, so he helped the carpenter get the materials ready and then he was off for the day. The carpenter worked hard all the day measuring, sawing, nailing.

At sunset when the elder brother returned, the carpenter had just finished his job. The elder brother's eyes opened wide and his jaw dropped. It was not what he had even thought of or imagined. It was a bridge stretching from one side of the creek to the other! It was a fine piece of work with beautiful handrails. And to his surprise, his younger brother who lives across the creek was coming to meet him with a big smile and arms wide open to hug him.

"You are really kind and humble my brother! After all I have done and said to you, you still show that blood relation can never be broken!" I am truly sorry for my behavior, the younger brother said as he hugged his elder brother.

They turned to see the carpenter hoist his toolbox on his shoulder. "No, wait! Stay a few days. I have a lot of other projects for you," said the older brother.

"I'd love to stay on", the carpenter said, "but, I have many more bridges to build!" (Moral Stories – "The Bridge")

The solemnity we are celebrating today, popularly known as Corpus Christi – The most holy body and blood of Christ, is the celebration of the "BRIDGE" given to us by Jesus as an efficient and effective means of uniting us with both God and one another. All who receive the body and blood of Jesus are called to become sisters and brothers in Christ.

However, given that even after the Last Supper with His disciples, we are still living in a hungry, angry and divided world where few people have more than enough food to eat and waste, while many are still starving means that Jesus did not intend to limit our understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist as a mere provision of material food to satisfy biological hunger but as a tool of trade that sanctifies, bridges and unites scattered children of God, and liberates us from the bondage of sin and ignorance.

Our God is a God who feeds His children and God has given us all that we need to produce enough food for all to have enough to eat. The reason for poverty and inequality in the world is not caused by God but by human wickedness, greed and selfishness, which makes us to build unjust structures meant to favor some people and oppress some people.

Seeing all that is going on in the world, Jesus gives us the supreme gift of His body and blood to empower us to work for the unity of all sentient beings. Those who eat the body and drink the blood of Jesus Christ are called to become Jesus made visible to others in the world.

By eating the body of Christ and drinking the blood of Christ, we should resolve to build bridges and not walls. We need to enter into communion with Jesus and become partners in progress with Him who died on the cross for the salvation of the world. We need to bear witness to the truth that we have been redeemed in Christ.

As a people who receive the body and blood of Jesus, we are called to live in unity, love and respect for others. The Eucharist is the apex and center of our life as a church and we must always gather together to break the bread and drink the blood of Christ.

The Eucharist means "Thanksgiving" and by celebrating the Eucharist we express our gratitude to God who loved us first with love beyond compare and we remain grateful for His continual presence in our lives.

Today, we resolve to become a people who revere and honor the real presence of Jesus Christ in the most holy and blessed Eucharist. Like the young boy, Blessed Carlo Acutis (the cyber apostle of the Holy Eucharist), who will soon be elevated to sainthood, we are called to fall in love with Jesus in the Eucharist.

Every mass we celebrate should become a golden opportunity to reflect, remember and make present that ultimate sacrifice on the cross through which heaven and earth unite as one and the church is renewed to remain a perpetual sign of God's presence in the world. We lay claim to salvation history, believing that what Jesus did more than 2000 years ago lives on in you and me.

Therefore, whenever we gather to celebrate the solemnity of Corpus Christi, we gather to renew a divine mandate given to us by God – to become the broken and shared body of Christ in the world today. It is therefore, our moral responsibility to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, house the un-housed, care for the sick and work for the reign of peace and justice in the world. Amen
