FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "A" "So do not be afraid" – Happy Father's Day.

Dad was distant. We never had a close relationship. Did he even like me? Sometimes I wondered. My father was taciturn, reserved, an academic. A neat freak. A perfectionist. A workaholic.

We were like sugar and salt. I was full of words — and problems, too. Dad said little, buried in work and his books. That's why my sister and I first lived with Mom in Illinois. But as I grew older, it didn't work out. Mom and I had issues.

I was bipolar, had OCD, and an eating disorder. It became too much for her to handle. So at 18, I packed up and headed for Minnesota to live with Dad. At least he would just leave me alone.

He was exactly as I remembered: introverted, distant. But he had a razor-sharp intellect and was very observant.

"I think you should eat more than just apples," he said one day.

Borderline anorexic, I was obsessed with becoming a dancer. My sick brain told me apples were the answer. I was surprised by Dad's words — that he'd noticed, that he cared. He was perched over our small kitchen table, slowly clipping coupons into perfect rectangles.

"That seems like all you eat," he concluded in a monotone tone. He didn't look up, his eyes intensely focused on his perfect stack of clippings.

Dad was right. It was all I ate. It's amazing I could walk to and from school in sub-zero temperatures on just a few apples a day.

"Well," I scoffed, "you don't even have Pop-Tarts or anything!"

Pop-Tarts — my weakness. I could never resist.

Dad didn't look up to acknowledge my plea. He didn't care about me.

I came home from class the next day. Time for an apple, I thought. So I opened the pantry. Inside? Pop-Tarts. Boxes and boxes, lined up in rows. My eyes filled with tears. Dad cared.

Things improved from there. I started to eat — Pop-Tarts, then real food. And I started to live. More energy. More alert. I walked everywhere.

But here's the remarkable thing: I had been wrong all along. I *had* a dad — someone who cared. What did I learn from those Pop-Tarts that day? People show love in different ways (Sharon — "My Pop-Tart Dad").

Today is a day to thank God for all fathers, living and dead. We pray for the eternal repose of the souls of fathers who have died and thank God for fathers who are in our midst. We thank God for the gift of fathers in the family, church, and community. Fathers not only carry on the tradition of our ancestors; they are also instrumental in innovations that sustain life on earth.

Our readings for this Sunday draw our attention to the different ways fathers live and support their families. In today's Gospel, Jesus said, "Fear not," because God knows and understands that fathers carry heavy and hidden burdens that they don't know who to share with. Jesus asks fathers to hand their burdens to God.

Today is Father's Day. It was in 1924 that President Calvin Coolidge first proposed that a national holiday be established in honor of Father's Day, but it was not until 1964 that Lyndon B. Johnson officially designated the third Sunday in June as the day to honor and celebrate the unique and indispensable role of fathers in the family.

Although celebrated in a low-key way when compared to Mother's Day, Father's Day is also gradually being commercialized as a day to give snappy ties, tool kits, car and phone gadgets, and expensive, trendy perfumes. But the intention, true meaning and spirit of Father's Day is something bigger. Today is a day we say "Thank You for being my father."

When Jesus said, "Even the hairs of your head are counted," He wants us to know that God notices even the smallest details of our lives. Even when human beings or family members do not recognize or appreciate our efforts, God sees every effort you make for the good of your family, and the God who sees what is done in secret will surely reward you.

Again, Jesus said in today's Gospel, "What you hear whispered, proclaim it on the housetops." With these words, Jesus encourages fathers to remember the faith and morals instilled in us as children, and to be bold enough to proclaim them loud and clear to our children. What kills a man is seeing and doing nothing, but what kills a child is hearing and doing nothing. "My people perish for lack of knowledge..." (Hos 4:6). Fathers should be courageous enough to speak the hard truth and show tough love when needed.

When Jesus said, "You are worth more than many sparrows," He calls for a confident trust in God. The good works of fathers are often presented as insignificant, but they are precious — like the sparrow — in the eyes of God. Fathers should be steadfast in their role as protectors, providers, and role models in the family.

On this special day, if your father is still alive, this is a day to look into the eyes of your father and tell him that you love him. Thank him for all he is doing for his family. Smile at your father whenever he comes back home from work, because the workplace is tiring and sometimes cruel to men like your father.

Finally, be grateful to your father who carried you on his shoulders and continues to carry you in his heart every day as he works hard for the good of his family. As you are grateful to your mother for the food she cooks, be also grateful to your father who often provides the money and teaches you the value of hard work and honesty.

And to those whose father's love and effort are not felt in the way they would like them to be, know that a father's love is understood better when you become a father yourself. Love your father imperfect though he may be. Let us be patient with our fathers and pray for them, especially today. May God bless all fathers. Amen.
