FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year “B” “He has done all things well - He makes the deaf to hear”

Who said that you can't be successful if you have a disability? Exactly, no one! People like Steve Wonder and Louis Braille have proven that a disability such as blindness doesn't have to hold you back in life. They have shown the world that even with no sight; you can still accomplish great things and reach your goals....

For those that don't know. Stevie Wonder is a singer-songwriter, musician and producer. He is often considered a musical genius and a pioneer in many musical genres.

Some of his biggest accomplishments:

- Wonder was the youngest solo artist ever welcomed into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame
- He sold more than 100 million albums
- Stevie won 25 Grammy's

His condition - Wonder has been living with his disability his entire life. Contrary to popular belief, Wonder wasn't born blind. Stevie was born two months premature. This caused his lungs to not function properly on their own yet.

He received too much oxygen in the incubator which led to disturbance in the blood vessels in his eyes. This condition is called Retinopathy of Prematurity. The condition caused Stevie to lose his eyesight.

However, his disability didn't stop the child prodigy from making a big name for himself in the music industry. But how does Stevie Wonder play instruments with no sight?

He taught himself to play the harmonica at five years old. When he was eight, he learned to play the drums by listening to the radio and mimicking the rhythm on a random surface in the house. During the early years of his career Wonder had many teachers that helped him improve his skills on various instruments.

Even though his career and accomplishments already give it away, Stevie has mentioned many times that his lack of sight doesn't hold him back and he doesn't see it as a disadvantage. He says that God has made him this way and that he had to take what he had and make something of it. And he sure did.

The first one in USA to use the Hable One - Fun fact, we met Stevie Wonder and he became the first person in the United States to use the Hable One! We met Stevie Wonder at CSUN in LA. This is one of the world's largest conferences for people with a visual impairment.

At the conference, Stevie walked in just after the time it was supposed to close and came directly to the Hable One booth. Here we gave a 20 minute demo, whilst he was using the product. As Stevie is quite a technical person, we were able to go deep into understanding the tech and he absolutely loved

it! (Hable – Blind Icons: The stories of 3 famous blind people who changed the world).

Today's gospel reading is a story about a deaf man who was healed at the request of those who brought him to Jesus. Of interest here is to note that Jesus was in the Decapolis which is mainly the gentile region. These gentiles were regarded by the Jews as sinful people who are not worthy to receive God's mercy and blessing.

It was a double whammy for the man since he was both deaf and a gentile (sinner). Orthodox Jews who believe that God's blessing is reserved for those who keep the law, could not have expected such a man to receive mercy and healing from God. Knowing what they were thinking Jesus had to do something out of the ordinary.

To heal the deaf man, Jesus took him away from the crowd. Of course, we know that Jesus could have easily commanded that the deaf man be healed with the crowd present and so will it be. Jesus did not do that. Jesus had to take the deaf man away from the crowd – does it mean that the crowd has something to do with the predicament of the deaf man? May be or maybe not.

The crowd, we know is senseless and emotionless. The crowd does not reason. The crowd has no eyes to see and no mind to reason. Living with the crowd and following the crowd is living with a group mentality. In this condition, we lack the use of our mind and depend on what others are doing or what we are asked to do. Such a lifestyle is not only miserable, it is also despicable.

When the crowd brought the blind man to Jesus, Jesus had to take him away from the crowd. This is to recognize and establish the fact that the blind is an individual who is worthy of mercy and blessing from God. Now, Jesus is able to establish a personal and intimate connection with the deaf man and he was healed.

Thanks to the people who brought the deaf man to Jesus. However, once the stage was set, neither the action of the crowd nor the faith of the blind man matters. All that matters was the mercy of God. Hence, Jesus looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to the blind man, “Ephphatha” which means “Be opened.” Immediately the deaf man's ears were opened and he was able to hear and speak plainly so that people may hear him.

In Jesus we see the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah – “Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God. He comes with vindication, with divine recompense – the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared ... the tongue of the mute will sing.”

It goes to mean that authentic faith is resilient. Crowd mentality does not lead to a genuine Christian life. It takes the individual with intellect and will to know God. We need to avoid following the crowd and work hard to establish a personal relationship with God.

Therefore, like the deaf man who did not doubt the power of God to heal him, we need at all times to avoid the temptation of giving in to apathy and self pity. The miraculous healing of the deaf demonstrates authority and divine power at work in the life of Jesus and serves as a reminder that God has the power to heal and restore the broken hearted to wholeness again.

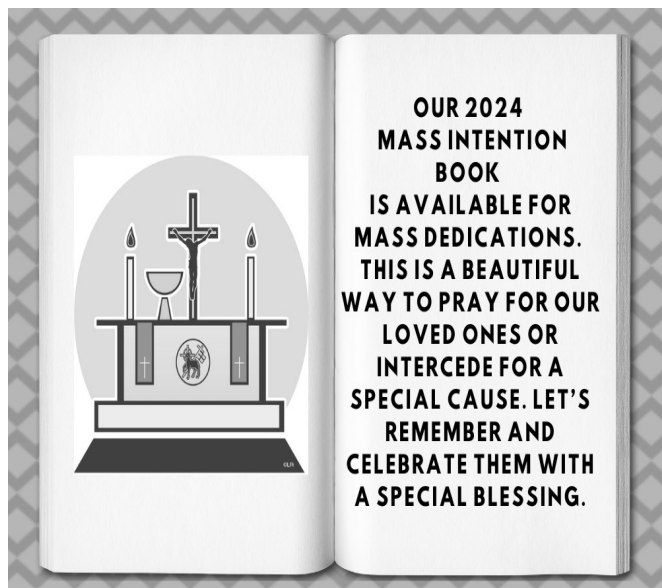

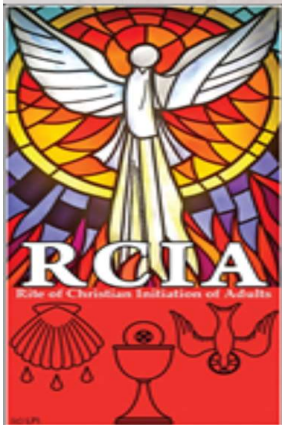
