FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

"They shall name Him Emmanuel – God is with us."

Is 7:10-14, Rom 1:1-7, Matt 1:18-24

"Wally and the rest of us" is the title of a Christmas story written by an unknown author. What to do with Wally? Wally was an awkward and shy child who belonged to the church kids' club. It was time to hand out roles for the Christmas play, but what role should the teacher give Wally? She decided on the innkeeper. It was an important role, but it required Wally only to shake his head and say one line "Sorry, we've no room." Wally grinned from ear to ear when he learned of his important role and he couldn't wait for the big night.

It arrived soon enough, and the play was proceeding according to plan. Mary and Joseph had traveled to Bethlehem and had come to the door of the inn. Joseph knocked on the door and it opened to Wally. "Please sir, do you have a room we could take?" asked Joseph. Wally shook his head and replied. "I'm sorry, we've no room".

Now the boy playing Joseph was a particularly confident child, and while the script called for him and Mary to turn away at this point, Joseph decided to exercise some dramatic license. "But sir" he said to the innkeeper, "My wife is about to have her baby and we need somewhere to stay. Couldn't you find us a room?" Wally's face went white. This was not planned for! He paused for a moment before repeating his line. "I'm sorry, we've no room."

"But sir" replied Joseph, "We've traveled such a long way and we've nowhere else to go and my wife is very tired. Surely you can find us somewhere." Wally bowed his head, shook it sadly and said, "I'm sorry, we've no room." Forlornly Joseph and Mary started walking away. Wally, now fully into his role, felt shamed and saddened. A tear trickled down his cheek. Then his voice was heard calling out. "Wait! Please come back. You can have my room."

It may not have been according to script, but at that moment Wally gave perfect expression to the Christmas story (Source: widely repeated story of unknown origins).

King Ahaz, like Wally read the script but unlike Wally Ahaz stayed put with the script. When the prophet confronted Ahaz with the message from God to "Ask for a sign from the Lord your God; let it be deep as the netherworld, or high as the sky!" King Ahaz refusal to change his mind and ask for a sign is not because Ahaz had so much love and respect for God. It is because Ahaz was quite confident that the pacts he made with neighboring nations will give him a better security and protection than relying on the power of God.

Little did Ahaz know that human promise is written on sand and not carved in stone. Those who put their trust in human beings are like a tree planted on a rocky soil. It germinates and grows up easily but when the sun shines it withers and dies. The one who puts his trust in the Lord is like a tree planted near the flowing river; it remains evergreen both in the dry and

Now, what the King in all his wisdom, power and wealth could not do for God is being done by a humble virgin and a simple carpenter from Nazareth. Although Mary could not understand the greeting and the message of Angel Gabriel – "Hail, highly favored one, the Lord is with thee" yet because it came from God, Mary believed. Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word." And the angel departed from her.

When the news reached the simple carpenter Joseph of the tribe of David, being a faithful Jew and an ardent observer of the law, there is no option left for him but to divorce Mary and look for another girl to marry; after all there is never a shortage of maidens in the land of Israel. Little did Joseph realize that this Mary is not just one of the girls in the land of Israel. She is the only one "full of grace" and "the Lord is with her."

In Mary and through Mary, God is not simply giving the world a baby boy. Through Mary, God is recreating the world – the child she will deliver will soon deliver the world. This is a feat that no other woman could achieve. Hence, Joseph had a choice either to stay with the script and divorce Mary or like Wally, follow his heart and listen to the voice of the angel that says to him "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her."

In Joseph, grace and law are at war. Joseph contemplates on the word of God which says "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." Should Joseph heed to the power of the law which mandates him to divorce a pregnant virgin, the salvation of the world is jeopardized. Should he take the leap of faith by listening to the voice of God, there are unlimited possibilities as to what life would become for him. In this struggle, grace triumphed over the law, hence the dawn of a new era for the salvation of the world.

Today, all the important actors in the story of human salvation have said a definite YES to God. We are almost a Christmas people because our salvation is near at hand. What kings and emperors could not do with their power and military might, Mary and Joseph are doing for us because they believed.

In this lies the power of faith. Impossibility is nothing to the one who believes because the power of faith does not lie in the one who believes but in the one who is believed – God. Hence, in any generation God uses mortal beings in the work of salvation. This is because salvation is not a human project. Salvation is a divine project. It is God who takes the initiative. All who believe become partners in progress in the civilization of love.

As we prepare to celebrate Christmas in a few days, let us walk in the light of faith and reach out to those who are at the margins of our society so that Jesus may be born both in Bethlehem in Judea and in our hearts and homes.





Holy Hour


Join us for an hour of meditation in the presence of Jesus. Everyone is invited. The service is bilingual and will be held inside the church.


